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Our History

- Olmsted Medical Center (OMC) began in 1949 as the solo practice of Dr. Harold Wenthe in downtown Rochester.
- Opened in 1955, the Olmsted Community Hospital ended its county affiliation and became part of Olmsted Medical Center in 1996. It is now called Olmsted Medical Center—Hospital.
- This year, OMC celebrates its 60th year of service to Southeastern Minnesota.

What We Do

- OMC is an integrated community healthcare provider known for convenient, expert, and personal primary care.
- OMC has more than 20 specialties including plastic surgery, obstetrics/gynecology, and occupational medicine.
- A not-for-profit organization, OMC cares for patients regardless of their ability to pay.

Where We Work

- 165 clinicians and nearly 1,000 staff provide healthcare services at 16 locations:
 - a multi-specialty clinic, physical therapy site, weight loss/wellness center, and two walk-in FastCare retail clinics in Rochester,
 - a 61-bed Level IV trauma hospital with urgent care and a 24-hour emergency department, and
 - primary-care branch clinics in 10 southeastern Minnesota municipalities (Byron, Chatfield, Pine Island, Plainview, Preston, Rochester, Spring Valley, St. Charles, Stewartville, and Wanamingo).

How We Have Grown

- Olmsted Medical Center has invested \$24 million in capital improvements during the past five years.
- The most recent hospital renovations cost \$10 million, began in September 2004, and were completed in December 2006.
- Renovations increased the hospital's physical space by 21,000 square feet.
- All hospital patients now have private rooms.
- Two new and three extensively renovated, spacious hospital operating suites are now in use—two with advanced arthroscopic and laparoscopic equipment, which permits minimally invasive joint and internal surgical procedures.
- Three hospital special care unit (SCU) observation rooms are now serving patients.
- Thirteen private, individual same-day-surgery rooms are now serving hospital patients.
- Greatly increased sterile instrument processing and supply space help OMC maintain an exceptional level of quality patient care.



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Olmsted Medical Center was among the first healthcare providers in the nation to:

- Become an incorporated medical group,
- Offer an employee retirement plan,
- Employ professional administrators,
- Computerize its business systems,
- Open branch clinics in neighboring communities,
- Employ a medical director,
- Become accredited,
- Have an organized quality improvement program,
- Establish a patient education department,
- Create a tobacco-free campus—the first in the state of Minnesota, and
- Open a store-front office (OMC began as a store-front office in downtown Rochester, then later at the Miracle Mile shopping center, and was the first Rochester healthcare provider to open a clinic in a retail environment. There are now two FastCare walk-in clinics located in Rochester’s Shopko stores).
